### SAMPLE

#### Rosa Parks

- 1 Many historians date the beginning of the modern civil rights movement in the United States to December 1, 1955. That was the day when Rosa Parks, an African-American woman who lived in Montgomery, Alabama, refused to give up her bus seat to a white passenger. Rosa Parks was arrested and fined for violating a city ordinance.
- 2 This event led to the formation of the Montgomery Improvement Association, which was led by the Baptist pastor Martin Luther King, Jr. The association called for a boycott that encouraged people not to ride the city-owned buses. This boycott lasted longer than 380 days. It brought Mrs. Parks, Dr. King, and their cause to the attention of the world.
- 3 Later the United States Supreme Court struck down the Montgomery ordinance under which Mrs. Parks had been fined. Rosa Parks' lonely act of defiance began a movement that eventually ended legal segregation in the United States.
